Tote Placement

All of the trucks that service your roll carts do so with an automated arm. When you roll your carts out to the curb, please make sure you're taking the following into consideration:

- Leave 3-5 feet between each cart whenever possible. This makes it easier for the automated arm on the truck to pick up each cart without knocking over the one next to it.
- Place carts within 5 feet of the curb.
- Do not block bike lanes, vehicle lanes of travel, or sidewalks.
- Make sure there is 18' of overhead clearance from items such as basketball hoops and tree branches.
- Do not place too close to your fence, sprinkler heads, yard lights, or anything else that the driver may not see when picking up your cart and therefore could potentially damage.

Curbside Recycling: If it's not a Yes...it's a No

The list of what is accepted in your curbside recycling has not changed, but do you know with certainty what is allowed? Please review this information and only include materials on this list. If an item is not on the "Yes" list, then it's a No.

Paper and cardboard: newspaper, magazines, junk mail, phone books, paperboard boxes (cracker boxes, etc.).

Cardboard: corrugated cardboard. *Flatten and cut into pieces no larger than 3' x 3'.*

Plastic: #1 and #2 bottles and jugs with a neck smaller than the base (ex: water bottle, milk jug), #5 dairy tubs 6 ounces or larger (ex: yogurt containers), rigid nursery plant pots, 5-gallon buckets. *Remove all lids.*

Metal: tin and aluminum cans, empty aerosol cans, scrap metal smaller than 36" and less than 45 lbs.

Common contaminants to leave out: styrofoam, plastic bags, wood, clamshell plastic, miscellaneous plastic packaging, to-go containers, plastic cups, paper plates/cups/bowls, freezer boxes, pet food bags, clothing, napkins/paper towels.

It is better for the overall recycling system to err on the side of caution. If you're not 100% sure if an item is recyclable, it should not be included. Contact us if you have a question.

When in doubt, throw it out!

Shred old documents and paperwork securely.

Pride Document Shredding offers shredding services at your home or business, with one time, occasional, or regular shredding. Secure drop off is also available at the Pride Depot in Sherwood. Whether at your home or place of business, disposing of intact confidential information is a risk. Contact us to have it shredded and protect yourself and/or your customers from this risk.

Pre-paid shred bags for \$5. Purchase a paper bag (grocery bag size) for \$5 from the Pride office. Take the bag home, fill it with paper to be shredded, and bring it back to the recycling depot to be shredded when it is convenient for you.
