What goes in the yard debris cart?

YES

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Weeds
- Branches and prunings (no greater than 4" diameter and 36" long)



NO

- Plastic bags (even if labeled "compostable" or "biodegradable." No plastic bags of any kind.)
- Food waste*
- Processed wood, lumber
- Dirt, sod, rocks, concrete, stumps
- Animal waste
- Ashes
- Garbage

*City of Beaverton customers:

Beaverton has started a yard debris and food compost program, which means in addition to the materials on the YES list above, you can include additional items in your cart. For a full list of acceptable materials please visit:

www.beavertonoregon.gov/1945/Compost-at-Home

The expanded compost program only applies if your home is within Beaverton city limits. It does not apply to your service if you have a "Beaverton" address but are located in Unincorporated Washington County. If you are not in City of Beaverton, your yard debris is processed at facilities that cannot accept food waste so it's important that you do not include food in your yard debris carts.

If you're unsure if you are part of this expanded program, please contact us to verify what can be included in your cart.

Plastic Products you CAN recycle at the curb

Place these items loose in your recycling cart if they are 6 ounces or larger. Rinse all containers before recycling. Remove lids and discard them in your garbage. If the plastic container previously held hazardous material such as pesticides, do not include it in recycling.



Plastic Bottles



Dairy tubs
(Yogurt, Margarine, etc.)



Milk Jugs



5-Gallon Buckets

Not pictured: rigid plastic plant pots (that do not crinkle when squeezed) can also be recycled curbside.

Note about Pride's Recycling Depot: Of the above plastics, only #1 and #2 plastic bottles are accepted in commingled recycling at the Pride Depot.

Shred old documents and paperwork securely.

Pride Document Shredding offers shredding services at your home or business, with one time, occasional, or regular shredding. Secure drop off is also available at the Pride Depot in Sherwood. Whether at your home or place of business, disposing of intact confidential information is a risk. Contact us to have it shredded and protect yourself and/or your customers from this risk.

Pre-paid shred bags for \$5. Purchase a paper bag (grocery bag size) for \$5 from the Pride office. Take the bag home, fill it with paper to be shredded, and bring it back to the recycling depot to be shredded when it is convenient for you.
