Battery and Motor Oil Recycling!

Battery and motor oil are both accepted and picked up on the same schedule as your glass recycling. Please read below for instructions on how to properly prepare your batteries and motor oil.

Batteries:

Place your household batteries in a 1-quart zip-sealed plastic bag and place the bag in your red bin. Wait until you have a full bag before putting your batteries out for collection. If your bin is full of glass, place the bag on top. If you do not have glass to set out, still place your red bin out and put the bag of batteries inside the bin.

Batteries Accepted:

Household batteries including alkaline, 6 to 9-volt, rechargeable alkaline, NiCad, lithium, silver oxide, and button cell batteries. All batteries, except standard alkaline, must have terminal ends taped. Limit of a single 1-quart bag per pick up.

Motor Oil:

Motor oil must be in a see-through 1-gallon container with a screw on lid (such as a milk jug) and cannot be mixed with any other fluids. Do not place oil back in the container it came in unless it's see-through. No more than (3) 1-gallon containers are allowed per pick-up. When the motor oil has been prepared properly for pick-up, place next to your red bin. If you do not have glass to recycle, please still put your motor oil in your red bin or next to it. **No other fluids are allowed curbside.** If the driver sees the motor oil has been mixed with another fluid, they will tag the oil and leave it.



Recycle+ Services!

Exciting news!! Recycle+ services are now available in the City of Tigard! This service is an optional expanded recycling service for hard to recycle items. There is an additional charge for this service. It's currently available to residential customers who live in Urban Unincorporated Washington County, King City, Tigard, Beaverton, Durham, and Sherwood.

In addition to your standard curbside recycling, with this optional service you can recycle hard to recycle materials including:

- Film Plastics
- #1 PET Clamshell Plastics (**must be clear and hinged on one side!**)
- Textiles
- Compact fluorescent light bulbs

Curbside Plastic Recycling

Place the following plastic items in your recycling cart if they are 6 ounces or larger. Rinse all containers before recycling. Remove lids and discard them in your garbage. If the plastic container previously held hazardous material such as pesticides, do not include it in recycling.



Plastic Bottles



Dairy Tubs

(Yogurt, Margarine, etc.)



Milk Jugs



5-Gallon Buckets

Not pictured: rigid plastic plant pots (that do not crinkle when squeezed) can also be recycled curbside.
