Holiday Pickup Schedule

The only holidays that our drivers do not work are Christmas Day and New Year's Day. When these holidays fall on a weekday, pickups are delayed by one day from the holiday through the end of that week. This year the holidays fall on Thursday, so Thursday and Friday customers will experience a one day delay. Please see below for details on the schedules for the Christmas and New Year's holiday weeks:

Christmas Tree Recycling



If you have yard debris service and would like your tree picked up, you can place your tree in your yard debris cart (or in place of your cart) on your regular scheduled yard debris day for no charge. If your tree is set out in addition to your cart, there will be a small fee. If you do not have yard debris service, please call our office to make arrangements for the tree to be removed.

<u>Please cut trees that are over 5' in half, if your tree is</u> wider than 4', it also needs to be cut in half.

Be sure to remove all lights, ornaments, and decorations. Wreaths are accepted if the wire frame and decorations are removed. Flocked trees are not accepted as yard debris but can be picked up as garbage.

If a non-profit organization is picking up your tree, please avoid scheduling it on your Pride Disposal pick up day to avoid any confusion.

Battery Recycling!

Old broken laptops, children's toys, cards that play music and other similar items all contain batteries. When it's time to discard and/or recycle them remember that those items can very quickly cause a fire in a truck load because of their batteries. It's very important to ensure that batteries are properly managed in the waste stream. We have a battery recycling program in all jurisdictions that we service.

Batteries are accepted and picked up on the same schedule as your glass recycling. Please read below for instructions on how to properly prepare your batteries.

Battery preparation:

Place your household batteries in a 1-quart zip-sealed plastic bag and place the bag in your red bin. Wait until you have a full bag before putting your batteries out for collection. If your bin is full of glass, place the bag on top. If you do not have glass to set out, still place your red bin out and put the bag of batteries inside the bin.

Batteries Accepted:

Household batteries including alkaline, 6 to 9-volt, rechargeable alkaline, NiCad, lithium, silver oxide, and button cell batteries. All batteries, except standard alkaline, must have terminal ends taped. Limit of a single 1-quart bag per pick up.



It is against the law in Oregon to put TV's, computer monitors, or laptops in the garbage. There are ways to recycle your electronics without sending them to the landfill.

These items contain valuable resources and may contain components that are harmful to the environment (and cause fires in our trucks!). We have a solution for you. We are a part of the Oregon ECycles program and we accept TV's, computer monitors, laptops, and printers at our recycle depot for free! If you're unable to bring them to us, you can schedule a bulky item pickup for a fee if you live in our service area.
